PRIMARY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. **Specialty Summary**. Maintains aircraft, support equipment, forms and records. Performs and supervises flight chief, expediter, crew chief, repair and reclamation, quality assurance, and maintenance support functions.

2. Duties and Responsibilities.

2.1. Performs sortie generation, ground handling, and servicing to include hot pit refuels. Performs preflight, thru-flight, end-of-runway, postflight, special inspections and phase inspections. Advises on problems, maintenance, servicing, and inspection of aircraft and related aerospace equipment. Uses technical data to diagnose and solve maintenance problems on aircraft systems. Supervises and performs aircraft jacking, lifting, and towing operations.

2.3. Supervises and performs aircraft, engine and component inspections. Interprets inspection findings and determines adequacy of corrective actions. Inspects and checks components for clearances, tolerances, proper installation, and operation. Performs pre-use inspections and operates powered and non-powered aerospace ground equipment. Inspects and identifies aircraft corrosion for prevention and repair. Reviews maintenance forms, aircraft records, automated maintenance data systems, and historical reports to ensure complete documentation. Inventories and maintains aircraft equipment.

Officer applicants cannot be reduced in grade to accept an AGR position. Officer applicants may not enter the AGR program in an over grade status. The initial tour length is three years. Failure to become AFSC qualified within the specified period is grounds for mandatory involuntary separation from the AGR program.
