MAN'S SEARCH FOR MEANING by Dr. Viktor E. Frankl

Chronicling his experiences as a prisoner in Nazi concentration camps during World War II, Dr. Frankl describes how he found the meaning of life. This involves identifying the purpose to each person's life through a combination of three pursuits: the completion of tasks, caring for others, and finding meaning by facing great adversity with dignity.

PEAK MIND: FIND YOUR FOCUS, OWN YOUR ATTENTION, INVEST 12 MINUTES A DAY by Dr. Amishi P. Jha, PhD

Our ability to pay attention is unreliable when we are under stress. *Peak Mind* is a guide to improving focus, productivity, and well-being through mindfulness.
